## A Cautionary Note:

## Recipes

## Gray or Black

1 part Portland cement 1 part peat moss 1 part vermiculite Add black tint for dark gray or black.

### White

1 part perlite 1 part vermiculite 1 part white Portland cement

### Red, Tan, Brown

Same recipe as white. *Add color tint to taste.* 

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
